Happy Trails



Well here we go, April is here and Spring has sprung. With Springtime comes the warmer temperatures and an increase in gator sightings! No, not the Florida type but the road gators. You know, the long strips of tread shed off of overheated truck tires. You see them all year long, however when the temperature rises, underinflation and other factors cause these huge tires to either explode or lose their tread and spoil our ride much more frequently.

Some of us, myself included, have been struck by chunks of flying rubber while passing a fifty three foot long semi that blew a tire. Some tips for a safer motorcycle ride are to stay clear of most larger trucks by not following them and passing them as quickly as traffic conditions allow.

If you don't wear earplugs while riding and you hear a loud thumping while passing a large semi, escape quickly as one of his tires is about to shed its tread. Another tell-tale sign that something bad is about to happen is the smell of burning rubber or smoke coming from either the truck or its trailers' tires.

These gators are quite heavy and often have steel wire belts protruding from the edges which are very sharp. They can and will damage your bike and easily slice through skin, so wearing good protective gear instead of just a t-shirt is a must.

Explanation of the GWRRA Rider Education Levels Program...

The GWRRA Rider Education Program (REP) is intended to make the motorcycle environment safer by reducing injuries and fatalities and increasing motorcyclist skills and awareness. The REP does not propose to have all the answers. However, our close-working relationship with the Motorcycle Safety Foundation (MSF), as well as additional GWRRA programs and studies, has provided a wealth of information for use in establishing a comprehensive Rider Education Program. Through Commitment, Education and Application, we can reduce our accident rate significantly. Listed below are several benefits of a fully implemented GWRRA Rider Education Program at the Chapter level:

- Increased rider knowledge
- Increased rider safety skills
- Prevention of accidents
- Reduced injuries
- Reduced fatalities
- Improved general public image of motorcyclists
- Enhanced enjoyment of motorcycle riding

The motorcycle community is already realizing many positive benefits from the GWRRA Rider Education Program. Through the efforts of the Rider Education Officers and participation of the membership and others, we will reach our goal of establishing the safest motorcycle environment possible.

One of the safety programs that GWRRA and our District is asking everyone to look at is the Riders Education Program and to be specific the level's Program. There are four levels to the program and each level is geared to make you a better rider and co-rider. Level 1 is as simple as saying that you are committing to riding safe then filling out the paper work and submitting it to our District Educator. I have just filled mine out and submitted it and look forward to working my way up through the other levels. I will have a members list at the meeting that will show where your current status is at and will have some forms for those wanting to get started. You can also go on the national web site and see your own status info that GWRRA has on you. To see it go to GWRRA (<http://gwrra.org/>) and click on the officer's tab and click on Rider Education. From here you can click on the levels program tab on the left side to read all about it or also on the left side click on My RE. Information then log in, your login name will be your membership number and your password will be the numbers of you address plus the expiration date on your membership card so for example if you address was 230 and you expiration date was 5/19 then your password would be 2300519. Once in you can see your GWRRA information, it's that simple. Hopefully everyone will join me and let's have some fun getting through other levels to make our favorite pass time a safe one.

Technical Bench

Technical Coordinator: Chris Harden



Your spark plugs can give you a lot of information as to how well your engine is running, and predict problems that are occurring long before you identify any other symptoms. Make it a habit of looking closely at your spark plugs every time you remove or change them. Here's what you can be looking for:

Normal



Brown to grayish-tan color and slight electrode wear. Correct heat range for engine and operating conditions.

Worn



Symptoms: Rounded electrodes with small amount of deposits on the firing end. Normal color. Causes hard starting in damp or cold weather and poor fuel economy. Plugs have been left in the engine too long. Replace with new plugs of the same heat range.

Carbon Deposits



Symptoms: Dry, sooty deposits indicating a rich mixture or weak ignition. Causes misfiring, hard starting and hesitation. Make sure the plug has the correct heat range. Check for a clogged air filter or problem in the fuel system. Also check for ignition system problems.

Ash Deposits



Symptoms: Light brown deposits encrusted on the side or center electrodes or both. Derived from oil and/or fuel additives. Excessive amounts may mask the spark, causing misfiring and hesitation during acceleration. If excessive deposits accumulate over a short time or low mileage, install new valve guide seals

Oil Deposits



Symptoms: Oily coating caused by poor oil control. Oil is leaking past worn valve guides or piston rings into the combustion chamber. Causes hard starting, misfiring and hesitation. Blue smoke will be seen coming from exhaust. Correct the mechanical problem causing the condition and install new plugs.

Gap Bridging



Symptoms: Combustion deposits lodge between the electrodes. Heavy deposits accumulate and bridge the electrode gap. The plug ceases to fire, resulting in a dead cylinder. Remove the deposits from between the electrodes.

Too Hot



Symptoms: Blistered, white insulator, eroded electrode and absence of deposits. Results in shortened plug life. Check for the correct plug heat range, over-advanced ignition timing, lean fuel mixture, intake manifold vacuum leaks, sticking valves and insufficient engine cooling.

High Speed Glazing



Symptoms: Insulators may be cracked or chipped. Improper gap setting techniques can also result in a fractured insulator tip. Can lead to piston damage. Make sure the fuel octane is high enough. Use care when setting

Mechanical Damage



Symptoms: May be caused by a foreign object in the combustion chamber or the piston striking an plug that is too long. Causes a dead cylinder and could result in piston damage. Repair the damage and correct the cause.

Coolant Leak/Head Gasket



Symptoms: Coolant is entering the cylinder, either through a leaking/failed head gasket, or a cracked block. The coolant "steam cleans" the plug, so the plug appears clean and shiny.

Mixture

Incorrect carburetor mixture can also be seen on spark plugs:

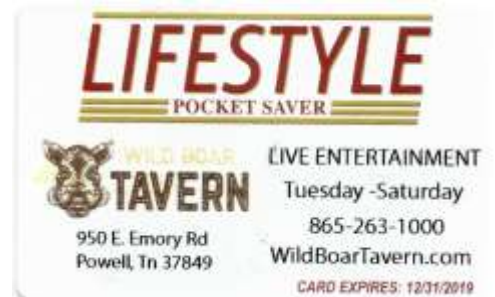

Coming from Knoxville

Highway 129 pass the airport, stay straight and go 3 traffic lights to Foothills Mall Drive, turn right go 2 lights turn right (McDonalds on right). Go 3 traffic lights turn left on to William Blount Drive. Follow road through one light (Big Springs Road) just past the light is Rubber Maid Newell plant entrance. Turn Right into plant entrance. Follow the road bearing left around the plant. Watch for the speed bumps, cross RR tracks bear left and follow the road around to the 911 center. There is a metal gate it may be closed if so just push button and the operator will open the gate. Park in the parking lot and come around to the back area (where the flag pole is located)

Coming from Lenoir City turn right at William Blount Drive. Follow above directions.

Coming from highway 411 from Madisonville turn left at light (William Blount Drive) Shell station on corner. Follow William Blount Drive past middle school and high school cross the over pass turn left into Rubber Maid Newell entrance. There is a Dollar General Store on the right. Turn into plant entrance and stay left. Follow above directions to 911 center.
