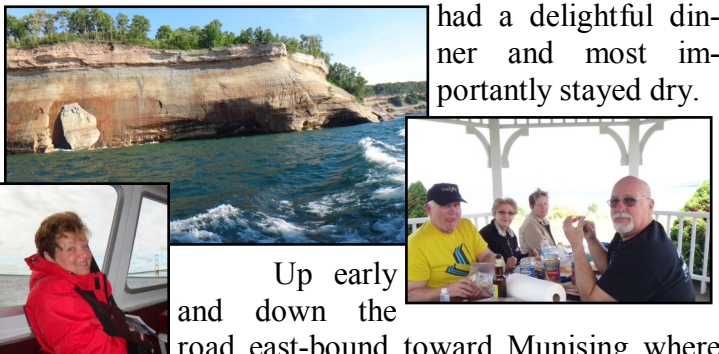


# WingDing 36 (Continued)

We had plenty of time to make it south at the start of I-75 to St Ignace where we got our

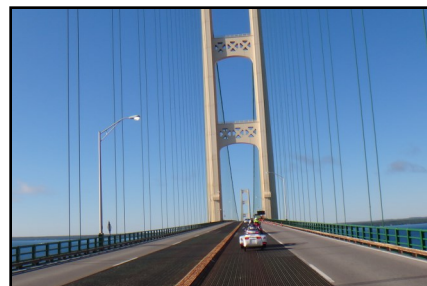

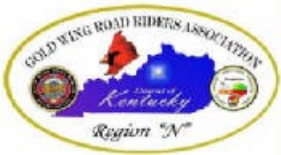

# Chapter Educator Section

Well, here we are with the month of July in the rear view mirror, and though we were treated to some cooler days at the end of the month, we're sure to get back to the heat of the season soon. While some of us enjoy nearby day trips, many opt for longer rides taking us out of state for days at a time. Most of us realize the dangers associated with riding motorcycles. Through skills training many of us have become safer riders in an ever growing hostile riding environment. The auto manufacturers and the various "wireless device" (aka cell phone) companies seem to come up with new ways every week for car, truck & SUV drivers to be distracted. Unfortunately, the situation is further complicated by the lack of mandatory safety equipment requirements for motorcyclists across the country.

Yes, we're all well beyond 3 times 7 and capable of making our own choices, however this is not the 1970's and almost all road-way hazards have increased tenfold. As many of you ride off to other states for a road trip you'll suddenly notice that most riders you encounter won't be wearing helmets, let alone no protective jackets or boots mainly because that particular state doesn't mandate that even helmets be worn.

Without that mandatory helmet law did motorcycle riding suddenly become "safer" or less hazardous to us in that state? Some riders tend to give in to the locals and want's to "fit in" to the area during their stay by go-

ing helmet-less and dressing in shorts, t-shirts and gym shoes while riding their motorcycles.

Many of these balmy vacation areas are even more dangerous than the roads back home. Vacationing van and SUV drivers are often unfamiliar with the roads as well as the distractions happening inside of their vehicles to even notice motorcycle traffic.

One more comparison. Near the end of this month the college football season gets under way. The players wear helmets and shoulder pads for protection much the same as we wear helmets and armored riding jackets for the same reason. Later this season UT will probably play the teams from UK and Florida while visiting their stadiums out of state. Being that Kentucky and Florida do not mandate helmet usage while operating a motorcycle, do you think coach Jones would allow his players to play football there without helmets? Of course not! That would be too dangerous.

Now don't cry FOUL for an unfair comparison. Football players are at running speed with anticipated collisions with other players on grass fields, while motorcycles are traveling at much greater speeds on harder asphalt and concrete not knowing what may collide with them! Remember to use common sense while riding.
