

Bike To Trike – When to Move

Most of us who fell in love with motorcycles have great memories of riding our motorcycles and falling in love with them as the wind whistled through our hair. If I asked any of you what was your first motorcycle, I know most of you could tell me the make, model and year and then go on to recount fond stories of carefree hours of riding and maybe even an adventure or two you had on that first bike. Some of you are newer to riding but pretty much if you are in the Sunsphere Wings you love motorcycles and probably have since you had a flat belly and a head full of hair. When I first began attending the Sunsphere Wings I was surprised by how many of the group owned and rode trikes! I had seen trikes on the road but had never been around them nor knew anyone that owned one. Suddenly, I was surrounded by them! During my few short years of being a part of this chapter I have asked many of you how you migrated from two to three wheels, and it has been interesting hearing your stories. I decided I wanted to do a three-part series on Trikes with the first article focusing on when a motorcycle rider should consider making the transition to a trike.

"I couldn't hold it up anymore"

I regularly surf Facebook Marketplace to see who is selling Goldwings. Elly May is 23 years old and, although she is humming along just fine, I would like to upgrade sometime in the near future. Sometimes when I see a GW for sale the seller will put their reason for selling in the description of their ad. The most common reason I read is 'I just can't hold it up anymore'. The GW is a beautiful machine but it is heavy! The dry weight of these bikes is right at 800 lbs and when you add your weight (I don't want to talk about it) and then the weight of a passenger (Hedie doesn't want to talk about that either!) you are quickly over ½ a ton! I am 58 years old and have very strong legs yet there have been a couple of times even I had to use all of my leg strength to keep Elly May from going over. This commonly happens when stopping on a sloped road or parking lot (there are many of those in the hills of Tennessee) or just losing your balance during a stop. As we age, holding up a GW is more difficult as our leg strength also begins to diminish. We just can't recover from off-balance situations like we used to.

The probability of getting hurt in relatively minor accidents

When you were 17 or 25 or even 38 having a 'slip and slide' on a motorcycle (one that didn't involve hitting another vehicle or a stationary object) may have bruised you up a bit and ruined your bike's paint job but you could probably walk away from it if you were wearing the right gear. That same accident at age 65 would have a totally different result. Many people who have switched to trikes did so because it greatly reduced the possibility of injury as it reduced the possibility of you kissing pavement. An accidental strike of a pothole on a trike may make for a pretty big bump but you are not in danger of going down like you could on a motorcycle. Riding a trike simply reduced your chances of being in an accident as it reduced your chances of being ejected from the trike and a trike is easier to see for motorists.

In the coming two months I will be discussing the transition from a bike to a trike and look honestly at the positives and negatives.

Be safe and keep that shiny side up!

Bike vs Weather which will win out in the end

Weather is hard on a motorcycle especially UV rays destroying anything made of plastic so what do you do leave it setting indoors all the time NO there is no fun in that so using protestants like Armorall or turtle waxes tire dressings are great ways to slow down the affects of the suns UV rays also I recommend to keep a cover with you on long trips to put over your bike at night to protect it from weather in the evening also it's nice to have a dry seat to start out with the next morning also keep your windshield clean as the acid in the bugs you hit can etch the windshield and paint I keep a small amount of cleaner and micro fiber towel in my bike to just for cleaning my windshield and front of bile when I stop for gas or to take a break. So to answer the question Bike vs Weather if you don't stay after your bike weather will win every time.




