



# Happy Trails



With March here now, springtime and the start of riding season will be here before you know it. As we grow older we find that more attention to personal health is needed. Various medical conditions develop which affect our quality of riding enjoyment. Shorter trips with more frequent stops often become the norm. Now would be a good time to schedule that annual doctor check-up to get a good evaluation of yourself for the riding season, instead of thinking that all aches and pains are just signs of getting older.

After getting the "All Clear" from the doc, think about how healthy your riding skills are doing. Most of us have had at least a 3 month vacation from riding and may need to get back into a "healthy" riding mindset. Riding skills books can be read and watching instructional videos can help sharpen your skills. Practicing cornering and braking skills in a vacant parking lot will enhance your control of your bike. And, not far down the road our District staff will probably be scheduling Advanced Rider Courses and Trike Rider Courses; which should be repeated every two to three years by all riders. Think of it as a booster shot for motorcycle riding! The rider coaches that run these courses will identify any areas of your riding that can be improved to further the quality of your riding experience.

Lastly, make sure your bike is road ready for the season before heading out on the highway.

#### **Battery Tender**

The importance of placing a battery Tender or maintainer on your motorcycle cannot be stressed enough during the times that the motorcycle is setting in your garage. There are several different makes of these. The battery will lose some of its charge each month that it is not used. In order to maintain a state of charge you must keep a battery Tender hooked up. This keeps the battery from becoming sulfated and it prolongs the life of the battery. Also, a battery tender or maintainer will not charge a completely discharged battery. A battery needs to have some sort of partial charge for the tender or maintainer to recharge it. Also, as a side note, there is a very good article in this month's Wing World magazine concerning the proper way to load and use a trailer behind our motorcycles/trikes.




